



Scholarship Policy 2010-11

It is the hope of CCS that financial need would never abridge an athlete's opportunity to play competitive sports. CCS also recognizes that its decision makers have responsibility to wisely use the funds entrusted to them by parents, fans, friends and patrons of CCS. More over, we are all accountable to God for our use of His resources. With these truths in mind, the following general policy is set forth:

1. CCS is primarily a parent/player funded organization. Families are expected to pay fees, deposits, bonds, and other expenses no later than the announced date due.
2. CCS Soccer is a competitive high school team. Therefore, scholarships will be limited to high school players in grades 9-12.
3. CCS does not have a designated scholarship fund. Monies used for scholarships are derived from fees paid by other player-families and donations.
4. When necessary, parents may request financial assistance. Parents should be mindful that they are requesting other CCS families subsidize their child's participation. Sharing one another burdens is a Biblical calling. Taking responsibility to meets one's own needs, if able, is also a Biblical mandate. Above all charity (love) toward one another, considering others more highly than oneself.
5. Scholarship shall not be awarded to cover the full cost of a player's participation, as there is value in the individual player and family retaining ownership reflected in their financial investment.
6. Scholarship funds may not be awarded to provide funds for player bonds.
7. Scholarship funds may not be awarded to cover the cost of damages to uniforms, equipment, or facilities that are due to the carelessness or negligence of a player.
8. Scholarship funds may not be used to purchase uniforms or CCS promotional items.
9. Requests for scholarships shall be in writing and presented to the CCS treasurer, assistant treasurer, or their designated representative. The requests should include the amount being requested, with an explanation of the reason for and circumstances of the request, as well as the name and sport of the player. The written request should include the name and signature of the parent or guardian making the request.
10. CCS will make every attempt to respond to requests in a timely manner. Unless Providentially hindered, parents should receive a response within two-weeks of presenting their written request.
11. Scholarships are available only to CCS families who have completed the Family Registration Form and paid the annual fee in full.

CCS recognizes that Providential blows may be cause for granting grace beyond the boundaries of the above policy. These are exceptions, and therefore shall be both rare and taken by exception on a case-by case basis.
